The conference titled "Borderlines: Redefining Political Landscapes in a Divided World" aims to explore the multifaceted dynamics of borders in the contemporary geopolitical context. - 5. Place of Work/Residence
- 6. Section in which the member wishes to present the paper
- 7. Title of the Paper
- 8. Mode of presentation: Online/ Physical

Please keep in mind the following additional points when submitting papers:

- 1. Papers must be written **in English or Bengali**, word-processed, and double-spaced. The paper should be sent only in WORD (.doc/.docx) file format. Please refrain from submitting hard copies or uploading the soft copy of the paper in PDF format.
- 2. Word limit: **3500 words (including endnotes)**. Any paper exceeding the word limit will not be eligible for inclusion in the Proceedings. The paper submitted should be in **Times New Roman font (for English), Kalpurush font (for Bengali), font size 12, double-spaced.**
- 3. References should be double-spaced and placed at the end of the paper, numbered continuously throughout the entire document (not per page).

- 4. When referencing printed books, the conventional system should be followed: Author's name, Title of the book, Place of publication, and Year of publication, in that sequence. For well-known journal abbreviations such as JIH, JASB, JRAS, EI, IHR, IESHR, and JESHO, utilise them without further clarification. Forms like 'ibid', 'Op.cit.' etc are recommended for conciseness.
- 5. If maps, diagrams, and photographs are provided, they should be limited in number and prepared in a format ready/suitable for printing.
- 6. Paper will be submitted through email <u>bvck.webinar@gmail.com</u> (Kindly submit the paper abstract as of now; the full paper shall be sought later.)
- 7. A HARD COPY of the paper must be submitted by the Paper Presenter at the time of the presentation to the Chairperson of the relevant session.
